From the Minister

Last Tuesday, February 18th, 10 members of our fraternity made a Franciscan presence at Holy Family, sitting together, up front in support of Fr. Johnpaul in his evening presentation regarding our Franciscan flavor on Creation, the Crib and the Cross. We sat together, listened, sang, prayed and helped plant a tree. Fr. Johnpaul acknowledged us. A friend came up afterwards and asked all kinds of questions about US...she is hoping to attend our next gathering. It is in the "doing together" in fraternity that we will attract others and grow our fraternity.

"Hope built on faith results in an increase of vocations"...this is a quote from Anne Mulgueen, OFS, National Formation Commission. Hope is the assurance of things not seen (Hebrews 11:2). WELCOME THE STRANGER

This is a new ministry that was selected for Outreach in 2025. Welcome the Stranger works in tandem with Exodus to provide the necessities that a family would need when moving into an apartment for the first time. We will be helping to provide these necessities in the months of **April** and **October.**

Welcome the Stranger conducts gatherings of these items through specific collection times at Holy Family Parish. The complete collection includes items for the kitchen, bathroom, bedrooms and cleaning supplies. The Council has signed up our fraternity to provide the items needed for the Bath. The necessary items are listed below. A sign-up sheet will be available at the March and September gatherings. Items selected will be brought to the fraternity gatherings in April and October.

Bath items to be provided:

Bath towel – hand towel – washcloth (multiple sets in neutral colors)

Bath mat – neutral color

Shower curtain with hooks – neutral color

Shower curtain liner (if shower curtain is cloth)

8 bars of soap

2 bottles of shampoo

8 toothbrushes

2 tubes of toothpaste

deodorant

10 disposable men's razors and shaving cream

feminine supplies (pads)

8 rolls of toilet paper

bottle of hand lotion

4 boxes of Kleenex

2 small trashcans
